

5 PILLARS OF BCSN

- 1. Collaboration: Embrace the power of teamwork within your BCSN Chapter and collaborate with other Chapters in your region or globally. Form diverse teams and leverage a variety of perspectives to plan successful initiatives.
- **2. Leadership:** Step into leadership roles and cultivate your leadership potential. We encourage BCSN Chapter leadership teams and all members to lead by example, inspire others, and proactively drive positive change.
- **3. Entrepreneurial Mindset:** Think creatively and boldly through an entrepreneurial mindset. Take risks, identify opportunities, act quickly, learn from the experience, seize opportunities, and develop solutions to address challenges at your school and in your community.
- **4. Global Connections:** Build connections with peers from around the world. Engage in global dialogue to deepen understanding of different contexts, cultures and perspectives on critical issues.
- **5. Social Impact:** Be a catalyst for positive change in your university and local community. Draw attention to critical social issues, engage in service, and develop initiatives that make a meaningful impact on people's lives.

 - Determine their own criteria for selecting/changing their BCSN Chapter Advisor, Lead Ambassador, Leadership Team, and Members


. Some options for the BCSN Chapter:

- . Have the BCSN Chapter be a branch of an existing student club
- . Combine Bachelor's and Master's students or have a separate chapter for each



BCSN PROGRAMS

- . BCSN Chapters plan events/opportunities that are open to:
 - Members of specific BCSN Chapters (leadership teams or all chapter members)
 - Chapter members in a region
 - . Chapter members around the world
 - All students at all Collaborative member schools
- . Chapters create events and opportunities that are relevant and valuable
 - Events are planned regularly that build connections and educate attendees about an important topic through the lens of the host(s) country/culture
 - Events can be academic, cultural, professional development, competitions, panels
 - . Events must have interactive components
 - Events can also be purely for social, networking and fun
- . English is the official language for BCSN communications
- . Events can be held in other languages if that is the primary language for the school(s) invited to participate.



REQUIRED CHAPTER ROLES

Schools must identify a student BCSN Chapter Lead Ambassador and a faculty/staff BCSN Advisor.

BCSN Chapter Lead Ambassador

- Work closely with the BCSN Chapter Advisor (faculty/staff)
- Primary liaison to the Babson Collaborative leadership
- Primaries contact for other BCSN Chapter Ambassadors
- Represent your BCSN Chapter
- Share opportunities and seek collaboration with other Chapters

BCSN Advisor

- Advise, support and encourage your Chapter
- Primary liaison to the Babson Collaborative leadership
- Primary contact to other BCSN Chapter <u>Advisors</u>
- Encourage your chapter leadership

SUGGESTED ROLES

- We suggest a small leadership team to start
 perhaps 3-4 roles
- The role of Lead Ambassador could be combined with one of these, but it may be best if it is a separate position
 - President
 - Events Coordinator
 - Marketing Coordinator
 - Secretary
 - Membership Coordinator
